Our state-of-the-art plasma manufacturing facility is one of the largest biotech manufacturing sites in Takeda. Our 160-acre integrated campus consists of three manufacturing buildings, multiple laboratories, warehouse and cold storage and office space. This facility delivers therapies that are imperative to meeting the needs of patients with primary immune deficiency disorders and chronic inflammatory demyelinating polyneuropathy as well as those who have suffered burns or other trauma.
